#### And so, we begin again

We welcome tonight's visitors Leiston to Latimer Park

After a summer of transfer whispers. sunlit pre-season optimism, and the inevitable churn of speculation, the real theatre resumes. The turnstiles click, the pitch is pristine, and for ninety minutes, we return to what really matters. league football. Competitive minutes. Points at stake. The Southern League Premier Central season begins here—and with it. the hopes of a club with a proud past and ambitions for a brighter future.

There's something about the first match of a football season that is unrepeatable. No matter how long one has followed this game—whether in the throes of childhood wonder or with the measured realism of a long-suffering veteran-it never loses its pull. The opening fixture is a clean page. Hope, after all, is football's oldest currency.

Statistically, there's more riding on today's game than many might believe. Since the current structure of Step 3 was established, over 60%

#### of promoted sides have begun their campaigns with a win or a

draw, suggesting that momentum forged in August can last deep into April. Momentum, in this game, is not an abstract ideal. It is tangible, measurable, and unforgiving to those who let it slip.

But of course, not every campaign is about silver polish and champagne. For many, this is about progress, identity, and resilience. A chance to establish rhythm, to introduce new signings not just to the pitch but to the people. The noise, the scrutiny, the expectation-none of it can be replicated on a training ground in Wellingborough.

As we stand at the threshold of another 42-game journey, one is reminded of Bill Shankly's famous assertion that football is not just a matter of life and death, but something far more important. Hyperbole, perhaps—but then again, try tellina that to the supporter who's

waited through a dreary close season for this moment, this whistle, this fresh

Tonight's opponent arrives with ambitions of their own, and they will not roll over lightly. But this is home. This ground, these seats, this noise—it all matters. This is a league that demands grit as much as guile. With clubs stretching from Halesowen to Hitchin, Stourbridge to Stamford, it is a physical, fast, and unforgiving competition. The margin between top seven and mid-table can be waferthin. Consistency is king.

And yet, Kettering fans have every reason to feel quietly optimistic. Attendances here continue to reflect one of the strongest community bases at this level-proof, if ever it were needed, that this club remains a cornerstone of the town. The average opening-day home win rate in Step 3 sits just under 45%, but those numbers only tell part of the story. Latimer Park, when in full voice, offers more than statistics—it offers belief.

There are debutants out there today. Not just on the pitch, but in the stands. Children seeing their first live match, eyes wide with wonder. New season ticket holders, freshly initiated into the rituals. Veterans returning to their matchday routines, scarves unfurled. memories rekindled.

This, then, is more than a game. It is a beginning. A prologue written in studs and sweat. There will be twists to come, no doubt. Highs and lows. But for now, it is simply the first step. And if history has taught us anything, it's that how you start often says a great deal about where you might finish.

So, welcome back. Welcome home. With the badge on our chest, and the roar of the Poppies behind us.

Let's make it count. Let the season begin.

The Poppies will be coming up against five new teams in this season's Premier Division Central.



Needham Market, Bury Town, Ouorn. Real Bedford and Worcester City will provide the new opposition and they will all be looking to make their mark this season.

The Marketmen re-join the Southern League following their relegation from the National League North last season as they ended the campaign in twenty first position, twelve points from safety.

Bury Town join us after winning promotion from the Isthmian League North after beating Brightlingsea Regent 1-0 in the playoff final watched by a crowd of 2139.

Northern Premier League, Midland Division champions, Quorn won their promotion after comfortably winning the title by eighteen points and scoring one hundred and four goals in the process.

Up next come Real Bedford, a side who took the Southern League Division One Central by storm last season winning the league by fifteen points, scoring a massive one hundred and twenty nine goals at the same time.

They have recruited well during the summer and could be a real threat this time around.

The fifth team we will be coming up against is a side that we have had many battles against in the past and it's great to see Worcester City back in action at Step 3.

City gained their promotion by winning their play-off final, 2-1, just up the road at Corby Town and this season they will be playing their home games at Worcester Warriors Rugby Club, which is a superb venue and will be well worth a visit when the Poppies go there on the first Saturday in September.

We lost three clubs at the end of the season, Lowestoft Town, Hitchin Town and Biggleswade Town were all relegated while Barwell were given a reprieve and stay up.

It promises to be another exciting season in the Southern League Premier Division Central division and I'm sure there will be many ups and downs, and twists and turns along the way.

# **CLOCKING UP THE MILES**

The Poppies will clock up over 2,500 miles on their travels this season with our longest trip of the campaign coming when we have to go to tonight's visitors, Leiston.

Other long trips will see us got to AFC Sudbury, Needham Market, Worcester City, Stourbridge and Halesowen Town.

Our shortest trip of the campaian is Harborough Town, which is a round trip of thirty four miles, while trips to Real Bedford, St Ives Town and Stamford AFC are well under the 100 mile mark.

# SOCCER IN THE SEVENTIES with Roger Rose

#### In 1972 Leeds United appeared in their third FA Cup final, losing their first in 1965 after extra-time to Liverpool and in 1970 to Chelsea in a replay.

The final marked the centenary of the first cup final when Wanderers beat Royal Engineers. Leeds' opponents, Arsenal, had won the cup the previous year sealing a league and cup double. Arsenal would be looking to emulate the achievement of Newcastle United in 1952 and Tottenham Hotspur in 1962 of back to back cup wins.

Arsenal suffered a blow in their semi-final with Stoke City when goalkeeper Bob Wilson suffered a season ending injury which would see reserve keeper Geoff Barnett playing in the final. Leeds ' keeper would be David Harvey who only became their first choice keeper the previous month replacing Gary Sprake.

Arsenal kicked off and within five seconds the first free kick was awarded as Allan Clarke blocked the forward progress of Alan Ball. Barely a minute later and the game had it's first booking, as Referee Mr David Smith sought to impose his control on the game, when a mistimed lunge by Bob McNab caught Peter Lorimer and not the ball.

Arsenal settled into the game quickly with Leeds appearing to be tentative feeling the weight of expectation on their shoulders. Neither defence were tentative though with no prisoners taken as forwards were closed down quickly and attacks broken up by any means.

Just after the quarter hour mark Norman Hunter was penalised for a foul on Charlie George. The resulting free kick was played into the path of Frank McLintock running from deep and his well struck shot skidding off the damp turf from the morning's rain forced Harvey into a diving save to his right. Leeds were now getting into their stride and having the majority of play but both defences were still on top.

Thirty minutes had been played when Arsenal won their first corner and nearly opened the scoring. The ball was lifted over and picked out Ball lurking on the edge of the penalty area. The England star hit the ball sweetly towards Harvey's right hand post but was denied a goal by Paul Reaney stationed on the post clearing away the shot. Leeds responded well and three minutes later a penetrating run by Clarke set up Mick Jones with a shot which passed narrowly wide of Barnett's post with the keeper diving vainly to his left. Shortly after the game got it's second booking as Hunter brought down Ball.


Shortly before half-time Leeds almost got the goal the game needed. A lofted cross from Lorimer was met by Clarke beyond the far post, he headed the ball goalwards and with Barnett beaten it stuck the front of the crossbar before being hacked clear. Just before the half-time Bremner was booked for dissent after questioning a Refereee's decision.

Shortly after the restart Charlie George was booked following a foul on Bremner, not for the foul but for back chatting Mr Smith. After fifty minutes Leeds got the ball into Arsenal's net when a cross from the by-line from Eddie Gray was deflected into his own goal by Peter Simpson but the ball had crossed the by-line.

Three minutes later the ball was in the Arsenal net again. Lorimer set Jones off down the right wing. He got past McNab and crossed the ball. Clarke central, about 12 yards out, with a diving header sent the ball rocketing into the corner with Barnett having no chance.







With twenty minutes to play Ball aimed a low shot from distance into a crowded penalty area. The ball struck the heel of a defender and broke kindly to George, who falling backward fired in a fierce shot. The ball cannoned off the crossbar with Harvey beaten and rebounded to Simpson who sent the ball harmlessly wide. This would be Arsenal's last threat on the Leeds goal. Shortly after Gray showed his skills taking the ball past Ball and cutting inside Pat Rice before unleashing a shot from the corner of the penalty area which Barnett diving at full stretch to his left palmed the ball away for a corner, saving a certain goal.

Arsenal made the only substitution of the game after seventythree minutes with Ray Kennedy replacing John Radford.

In the final minute of normal time Hunter played a ball forward for Jones to run onto. He collected the ball and turned McLintock inside out and made directly for the Arsenal penalty area. Barnett came out to close him down on the edge of the 6 yard box where Jones wearily tumbled over the keeper. Play continued with Jones in pain on the floor until the final whistle sounded shortly after. It later transpired that Jones had dislocated his elbow after falling awkwardly. As he was receiving treatment on the pitch his teammates went up to collect the cup. Leeds' substitute Mick Bates collected Jones' medal on his behalf. Jones refused to miss his opportunity of meeting the Queen and climbed the steps aided by Hunter to shake hands with Her Majesty. As Leeds paraded the

cup around the pitch Jones was carried to the changing room on a stretcher.

This final would be, to date, the last cup final of any competition won by Leeds United.


This evening we welcome our KTFC U11's Academy side as our team mascots.



# THE POPPIES IN PRE-SEASON

Its been a long pre-season for Kettering Town and a pre-season that has also seen many changes to the playing squad and management team.

Last season's Manager, Richard Lavery, left the club and he was replaced by the former Banbury United manager, Simon Hollyhead, who has had a busy few weeks since his appointment, as he prepares for the new season.

Oh yes, and along the way there have been six pre-season friendlies, with plenty of goals and plenty of wins.

It all started way back on Saturday 5th July when we travelled to Huntingdon Town and returned home 4-0 winners and then seven days later we returned from Desborough Town with a 2-0 win under our belts.

It was then time for cup action when we travelled to Moulton FC for a first round tie in the Northants Hillier Senior Cup and a good performance saw us run out 3-0 winners.

On the final Saturday of July we travelled to the Oval, to face the 'Greenbacks' of Bedworth United where we emerged 4-3 winners. The month ended with a 1-1 draw at Evesham United.

Our final pre-season game was our only one here at Latimer Park when we welcomed Basingstoke Town, a week last Saturday. This is how the Poppies Media reported the game.

It was a beautifully sunny day at Latimer Park with the sun glinting off the new scoreboard at the Morrisons end of the ground as the Poppies entered the field of play.

With Paul White unavailable, Callum Powell recovering well but not fit enough to play, injured, there were just two changes from the Tuesday night clash with Andi Thanoj on the bench and the arrival of our new loan signee, Archie Crowther who started the game.

The Poppies started brightly and soon applied pressures on 'The Stokes' defence with Fatadjo producing a slide rule pass to Lobjoit who forced an early save from the away goalkeeper with a curling effort producing a corner.

● 1-0 / The Poppies found an opening on 19 minutes after Loza was brought down in the penalty area and he recovered to produce a bullet of a penalty down towards the keeper's right.

Simon Hollyhead's side continued the free flowing attacking football, which characterised the first half, with a move in the twenty second minute which resulted in Fatadjo making an incisive pass through the Basingstoke defence to Lobjoit who aimed a ferocious volley at the visitor's goal forcing a good save.

● 2-0 /The home side extended their lead as Archie Crowther, on his debut, headed home at the front post from the resulting corner with the ball nestling in the keeper's right-hand net. It was almost a carbon copy of the goal he forced last season at the same end.

Hollyhead was forced into an early change as Fatadjo had to leave the field with a suspected broken arm following a midfield tussle with a Basingstoke defender. He was replaced with Andi Thanoj after twenty nine minutes.

Both Loza and Stanley looked lively and a constant threat with Lobjoit











having the most significant strike following some neat interplay as he dragged his effort just wide of the goal.

◆ 2-1 / Basingstoke halved the deficit just before half-time after an initial shot cannoned off the Kettering post and the number seven collected the ball on the six-yard line, cut inside and scored at close range.

Both Flynn and Stanley were substituted at half-time, with Corrigan and York replacing them, respectively.

€ 2-2 / The Stoke began the second half with the clear intention of winning the game and they equalised on fifty one minutes after confusion in the Poppies backline allowed for a low cross which reached the opposing number ten who scored past Humphrey.

It was a physical encounter and with Basingstoke increasingly pushing for the winning goal, Hollyhead made further changes in the latter half of the game with Oppong being replaced by Fifield and Trialist A replaced by Trialist B on sixty four, and then Loza replaced by Ranger after eighty three minutes).

The Poppies had a few promising, but ultimately unsuccessful attempts on goal, most notably by

the effervescent Fifield who had his shot from outside the area agonisingly glance past the opposition's righthand post.





### POPPIES IN PROFILE

# LEVI Andoh

#### LEVI WAS BORN IN AMSTERDAM, HOLLAND ON THE 12TH MARCH 2000.

After moving to England at the age of six he joined Aston Villa's academy at the age of six before being released at the age of fourteen

He then had trials at Port Vale, Walsall and Wolverhampton Wanderers but in 2017/18 he began his non-league career at Cradley Town.

Levi then had spells with Worcester City and Solihull United before agreeing to join Ipswich Town in January 2020.

Ipswich were then in League One and in October 2020 he enjoyed a loan spell with Lowestoft Town before making his Ipswich debut in November 2020 in a 2-0 EFL Trophy defeat away at Crawley Town.

Another loan spell followed, this time at Dartford, but in September 202lit was announced that he had joined Hereford initially on a month's loan. His loan was extended but after returning to Portman Road he was released by the club at the end of the 2021/22 season.

Levi re-joined Hereford on a permanent basis in January 2023 and on that same day he scored on his second Hereford debut in a 1-1 draw against Kidderminster Harriers.

On leaving Hereford, Levi joined York City in July 2023 but after just four games for the Minstermen he suffered a bad injury which was to keep him out for the rest of the season.



In August 2024 in a bid to regain fitness he joined Darlington for a month making six appearances before beginning another loan spell at Truro Cit

He returned to Hereford for a third spell on 29 January 2025, joining on loan for the remainder of the season.

He was ruled out for the remainder of the season after making 12

appearances, after breaking his collarbone against Scarborough Athletic on 15 March.

It was announced in May 2025 that his contract with York would not be extended and he would leave the club at the end of the 2024–25 season.

On 20 July, Andoh signed for Kettering Town.
